### **Grand Knight's Message**

Dear Brother Knights and Honored Clergy,

“In service to one, In service to all”

Servant leadership can be found in many religious texts, though the philosophy itself transcends any particular religious tradition.

In the Christian tradition, this passage from the Gospel of Mark is often quoted in discussions of servant leadership (Mark 10:42-45):

42 Jesus called them together and said, “You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them.

43 Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant,

44 and whoever wants to be first must be servant of all.

45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.”

While servant leadership is a timeless concept, the phrase “servant leadership” was coined by Robert K. Greenleaf in “The Servant as Leader”, an essay that he first published in 1970.

In the essay, Greenleaf said:

“The difference manifests itself in the care taken by the servant-leader: first to make sure that other people’s highest priority needs are being served. The best test, and difficult to administer, is: Do those served grow as persons? Do they, while being served, become healthier, wiser, freer, more autonomous, more likely themselves to become servants? And, what is the

effect on the least privileged in society? Will they benefit or at least not be further deprived?"

Robert Greenleaf recognized that organizations as well as individuals could be servant-leaders. Indeed, he had great faith that servant-leader organizations could change the world. In his second major essay, "The Institution as Servant" (1972), Greenleaf articulated what is often called the "credo." There he said:

"This is my thesis: caring for persons, the more able and the less able serving each other, is the rock upon which a good society is built. . . . . If a better society is to be built, one that is more just and more loving, one that provides greater creative opportunity for its people, then the most open course is to raise both the capacity to serve and the very performance as servant of existing major institutions by new regenerative forces operating within them."
